Past Perfect vs Past Perfect Continuous We form the Past Perfect with had and the past participle: Had + Past Participle Past Perfect Continuous Tense: We form the Past Perfect Continuous with had been and the -ing form of the verb: Had been + V-ing Past Perfect vs Past Perfect Continuous Differences in Usage The past perfect tense expresses a past action, already finished when another past action happened; the past perfect continuous tense describes a past action which started in the past and continued to happen after another action or time in the past. Examples: I met them after they had divorced. (past perfect) Sara had been working here for two weeks when she had the accident. (past perfect continuous) The past perfect tense emphasizes the result of an activity in the past; In contrast, the past perfect continuous tense emphasizes the duration of an activity in the past. Examples: I had been to London twice by the time I got a job in New York. (past perfect) Richard needed a holiday because he had been working hard for six months. (past perfect continuous) The past perfect tense shows two events in the past that are linked, while the past perfect continuous tense shows the cause of a past action. Example: I couldn't take my flight because I had forgotten my boarding pass. (past perfect) I had been travelling all night, so I was tired. The action may not be finish at that time. This action may still be continuing or may have just finished. Example Sentences He has been running that company for 10 years. I have been reading this novel for 5 days. We have been talking with Lisa for hours. She has been cleaning the room since morning. Past Perfect Continuous Past Perfect Continuous Tense is used to express a past action which started in the past and continued to happen after another action or time in the past. Past Perfect Continuous Tense tell us “how long the action had continued” or “ the duration of the action” is emphasized more in this tense. Example Sentences We had been looking for the wallet for 2 hours when Susan found it. She had been writing reports since morning when the boss came the office. They had been celebrating their wedding anniversary for hours when David arrived.
